Introduction

This list was conceived when I was scanning all of the museum's artifact sheets into the museum computer, making me the first and probably last person to ever run through the entire catalogue. The unparalleled opportunity to learn what the museum's collection holds gave me the the idea to create a handy index of various resources useful for genealogical and other local history projects which are at the immediate disposal of the Birdtail Country Museum. This list is not complete, nor has it even been proofread since I ran out of time. However, it does contain everything I encountered and thought relevant in the catalogue, and so can still be of use; this is not say that it couldn't use some work, even in its categories.

Though some items herein have more than one copy in the collection, usually only one artifact number has been added for each of them for expediency's sake; the idea is not about keeping an accurate record so much as about knowing what the Museum has available. Furthermore, some indexed items are not artifacts and so have never been catalogued. I didn't try to locate the bulk of the items listed.

Introduction to Second Edition

This list is still not complete, and could especially use the locations of these materials. As usual, I didn't properly calculate the amount of time allocated to the project; nevertheless, I have made some additions to the Museum's research materials list. One of my concerns last year was the make-up of my categories, and I have somewhat attempted to address that this year. Something I missed this year was including the authors of articles in the *Foxwarren Historical Society Journal*.

For one, I've added sections on specific localities around Birtle, and duplicated a number of records which fit both into the extant categories and the newer geographical categories. However, some items which probably should be in more than one category probably aren't. Other new categories include one for scrapbooks and the Miscellaneous Research Scraps sections.

The Miscellaneous Research Scraps are divided into three, one for people, one for places, and one for artifacts. The idea is that research done on certain individuals and localities is often lost to anyone doing the same research later, especially if it's in response to a specific inquiry. The idea is that any research/correspondence or whatever pertaining to a specific person, place, or artifact can be added to an existing file on him/her/it, and if none already exists, such a file can be created to save the next person coming along a bit of time. The three sets of files are divided into separate archival boxes on the research shelf.

1840-1923. Farmer; hunter; Adjutant General to Louis Riel during the Red River Rebellion. Presided over Thomas Scott's court martial.
- Dr. Amelia Yeomans, 1985
1842-1913. Early woman physician in Winnipeg; suffragette leader; Temperance Leader.
- Ancient Traders in Southern Manitoba, 1989
Ornaments, seashells, obsidian, copper, flint, and catlinite were traded in the area before Europeans' arrival.
- The Anson Northup, 1982 [724-84-G]
Reached Fort Garry in 1859. First steamboat on the Red River; renamed *Pioneer* in 1861; sunk that winter.
- Archway Warehouse, Jail and Powder Magazine, Norway House, 1985
Norway House was a vital centre in the HBC's trade network across the Northwest.
- The Arctic Small Tool Tradition in Manitoba, 1990
The conditions of the Canadian High Arctic encouraged technological innovations by those living there.
- Asessippi Townsite, 1981 [Two copies, both in English, 724-84-G and 3603-99-G]
Founded in 1882 by the Shell River Colonization Company, but its charter was revoked in 1888.
- Assiniboin (Nakota) First Nation, 1997 [bilingual copy]
Known as bison hunters of the northern plains who came to play prominent roles in the fur trade.
- The Beginning of the Jewish Community in Manitoba
Fleeing Czarist persecution, 350 Jewish refugees arrived in Winnipeg in 1882.
- Brandon College, 1983 [Two copies, 724-84-G and 3603-99-G]
Established by the Baptist Union of Canada in 1899. Incorporated as non-denominational in 1938, became independent in 1967.
- Brandon Normal School, 1985
Completed in 1913, one of four Normal Schools in Manitoba devoted to training teachers in the province.
- Cuthbert Grant, 1983 [724-84-G]
1793-1854. Métis leader; founder of Grantown; Warden of the Plains; Councillor, Sheriff and Magistrate of the District of Assiniboia; supported the Northwest Company and led its forces at the Seven Oaks massacre.
- The Dakota Fortified Camps of the Portage Plain, 1990 [one English copy, one bilingual copy]
The eastern Dakota (Sioux) often built fortifications around their camps. Three can be found near Portage.
- Dr. David Alexander Stewart, M. D., 1982 [724-84-G]
1874-1937. Teacher; clergyman; reporter; physician particularly interested in tuberculosis; helped found the Manitoba Sanitorium; amateur historian interested in the fur trade.
- Duncan McRae, 1983 [724-84-G]
1813-1898. Stonemason for the Hudson's Bay Company; helped build a number of Winnipeg landmarks
- Dr. Frank Leith Skinner, 1981 [724-84-G]
1882-1967. Horticulturalist in the Dropmore district; bred Old World plants to stand the prairie climate.
- Major Charles Arkoll Boulton, 1981 [724-84-G]
1841-1899. Founder of Russell and Shellmouth; railway promoter; politician; war hero; opposed Louis Riel in both 1870 and 1885; appointed to the Senate in 1889.
- The Cross of Freedom, 1984
Early Ukrainian settlement in Manitoba.
- Display Building Number II Brandon, 1984
Built in 1913 when Brandon hosted the Dominion Fair. Beaux-Arts Classicism style.
- E. Cora Hind, 1982 [two copies in English, one marked 3603-99-G]
1861-1942. Legal secretary; typist; Temperance activist; suffragette; agricultural editor of the Free Press.

- *Extinct Bison of Manitoba*, 1988
A look at bison species in North America before the *Bison bison bison* (the one we're familiar with).
- *The Emerson Court House and Town Hall Building*, 1985
Completed in 1918. Neo-Classical style municipal building.
- *First Farmers in the Red River Valley*, 1994
Date to the 1400s. Influenced by the farming cultures of the upper Mississippi and Missouri river valleys.
- *The Fossil Elephants of Manitoba*, 1990
Mammoths and mastadon bones have been found in the province. They likely died out 10,000 years ago.
- *Frederick Philip Grove*, 1981 [724-84-G]
1879-1948. German-Canadian author; teacher; his work recorded pioneer life in Manitoba.
- *The Fur Trade in the Scratching River Region*, 1984
Scratching River now known as Morris River. Rival trading posts established in 1801-1802
- *The Fur Trade in the Swan River Region*, 1983 [Two copies, 724-84-G and 3603-99-G]
Fiercely contested between the HBC and NWC. First trading post in the region erected in 1787.
- *Gabrielle Roy: The Manitoba Years*, 1991 [one bilingual copy]
1909-1983. Franco-manitoban author; international reputation; her first and most famous novel, *Bonheur d'occasion* was translated into English as *The Tin Flute*.
- *Georges-Antoine Belcourt*, 1984 [two copies, one in English, one in French]
1803-1874. Missionary; supported Métis grievances against the HBC and Roman Catholic hierarchy.
- *Government House*, 1984
Residence of Lieutenant-Governor of Manitoba since 1883.
- *The Former Great-West Life Building Winnipeg*, 1986
Completed in 1911. Designed by J. D. Atchison; Neo-Classical facade; vacated by the GWLA Co. in 1959.
- *Grund Lutheran Church*, 1989
Built in 1889. The Frelsis Church at Grund is the oldest Icelandic Church in Canada.
- *Reverend Henry Bud*, 1981 [724-84-G]
c.1812-1875. Missionary; translator; first native Anglican Priest in Western Canada; served The Pas region.
- *The Hudson Bay Railway*, 1982
Agitation for its construction began in the 1870s, but not completed until 1929.
- *Ibister School Winnipeg*, 1984
Oldest surviving (as of 1984) public school building in Winnipeg. Used as a model for other schools.
- *Joseph Dubuc, K.S.M.G.*, 1981 [724-84-G]
1840-1914. Lawyer; politician; MPP and provincial cabinet minister; MP; Chief Justice of Manitoba; supported Louis Riel in 1870 and tried to preserve French Canadian equality in Manitoba.
- *Joseph Royal*, 1983 [Two copies, one in French and one in English, both 724-84-G]
1837-1902. Lawyer; journalist; politician; founder of *Le Métis* newspaper; MP and provincial cabinet minister; MP for Provencher; Lieutenant-Governor of the Northwest Territory.
- *Kildonan Presbyterian Church*, 1981 [724-84-G]
Completed in 1854. First Presbyterian Church in Western Canada.
- *The Legend of White Horse Plain*, 1983 [Two English copies under 3603-99-G]
A horse roaming a part of Manitoba in memory of two lovers, a Cree and an Assiniboine, killed by Sioux.
- *Lillian Beynon Thomas*, 1983
1874-1961. Journalist; social reformer; temperance advocate; leading figure in the suffragette movement.
- *The Mandy Mine*, 1981 [724-84-G]
Discovered in 1915. Became Manitoba's first productive copper mine in 1916.

- *Manitoba's Boundaries*, 1983 [two copies, one English, one bilingual which was redone in 1994]
Expanded from 'postage stamp' size in 1881, and again in 1912.
- *Mennonite Settlement: The East and West Reserves*, 1981 [724-84-G]
Arriving on the Prairies in 1875, Mennonites first used the open field system in their reserved townships.
- *Nellie McClung*, 1981 [Two copies, one of which is under 724-84-G]
1873-1951. Author; teacher; suffragette; the most famous figure in the Canadian suffragette movement.
- *The Nor'-Wester*, 1981 [724-84-G]
1859-1869. First newspaper of the Canadian prairies; constant advocate for entry into Confederation.
- *The Origin of the Name Manitoba*, 1982 [Two English copies, both 3603-99-G; one bilingual copy]
From Cree name for Lake Manitoba, *Manitou bau*, or "narrows of the Great Spirit."
- *The Pas Community Building and Court House*, 1988
Completed in 1917. Symbolized Manitoba's determination to properly integrate its newly acquired regions.
- *The Pas Moraine and the Mossy Portages*, 1997 [bilingual copy]
A natural highway between Central Manitoba and Saskatchewan, especially used during the fur trade era.
- *Chief Peguis*, 1982 [3603-99-G]
1774-1864. Chief of the Saulteaux, whom he brought to Netley Creek; supported HBC against NWC; ceded land to the Selkirk settlers; important defender of Native rights.
- *Pascal Breland*, 1984 [two copies, one in French, the other in English]
1811-1896. Member of Council Assiniboia, of Manitoba's Legislative Assembly, and of the Council of the North-West Territories; businessman; farmer; early political leader of the Métis in the Northwest.
- *Peter Fiddler*, 1982 [3603-99-G]
1769-1822. HBC labourer; fur trader; explorer; surveyor; guide.
- *Pierre Falcon*, 1984 [two copies, one in French, one in English]
1793-1876. Magistrate; early settler in Grantown; popular early Manitoba songwriter.
- *The Red River Settlement*, 1988 [one English copy, one bilingual copy]
Founded in 1812 after Lord Selkirk bought the land from the HBC and opened it to agricultural settlement.
- *The Salvation Army*, 1986
Founded in 1865 to improve the conditions of London's urban poor. First established in Manitoba in 1886.
- *Seven Oaks House*, 1983
Built in 1853 by John Inkster; one of Manitoba's oldest surviving homes; near the famous Seven Oaks.
- *Sigtryggur Jonasson*, 1984 [two copies]
Canada's first Icelandic settler; immigration agent; founder of *Framfari* newspaper, the first Icelandic paper in North America.
- *Silver Heights*, 1983 [724-84-G]
Winnipeg neighbourhood; previously a log cottage then mansion on the Portage Trail near the Assiniboine.
- *St. Anne's Church, Poplar Point*, 1983 [724-84-G]
Completed in 1864. Anglican; one of the oldest log churches still in use in Western Canada.
- *St. Boniface*, 1988 [one English copy, two French copies]
First settled in 1817 and incorporated in 1883, the area still retains a franco-manitoban identity.
- *St. Michael's Ukrainian Greek Orthodox Church*, 1981
Consecrated in 1899. First permanent Ukrainian church erected in Canada.
- *St. Paul's Middlechurch*, 1983 [724-84-G]
Opened in 1825. Anglican church between St. John's and St. Andrew's; replaced due to flood damage.
- *St. Peter's Church Dynevor*, 1983 [724-84-G]
Built in 1853. Anglican; one of the Prairies' oldest stone churches; served the St. Peter's Indian settlement.

- *St. Norbert*, 1996 [one bilingual copy]
Early Métis settlement in Red River. St. Norbert was at the centre of the Red River Rebellion.
- *St. Norbert Heritage Park Manitoba*, 1983 [724-84-G]
Opened in 1984.
- *Thomas Douglas, Fifth Earl of Selkirk*, 1982 [two English, one of which is 3603-99-G]
1771-1820. Founded an agricultural colony around Red River.
- *Through the Ages in the Swan River Valley*, 1984
History of the region pre-permanent European agricultural settlement.
- *Walter Lynch, Leader of the Lynch Party*, 1981 [724-84-G]
Lynch, a member of the 1870 Wolseley Expedition, led an early group of settlers to Manitoba; their scientific approach to agriculture brought them individual credit and helped develop the province.
- *Wild Ricing in Manitoba*, 1989
A staple of local First Nations for over a thousand years. Also sustained European traders and explorers.
- *Captain William Kennedy*, 1985
1814-1890. Arctic explorer, HBC fur trader, supported annexation of Rupert's Land by pre-Confederation Province of Canada.
- *The Women's Institutes of Manitoba*, 1983 [724-84-G]
First founded in 1910. Acted as important social, cultural, and educational centres for rural women,
